Changes for the 2016 Grades 3-8 English Language Arts and Mathematics Tests

The State Education Department recently announced that changes have been made to both the ELA and Math exams that will be administered to students in grades 3 to 8 in 2016. The changes that will most directly impact students are:

- > Decrease in the number of test questions on both exams
- A shift to untimed testing to allow each child to work at his/her own pace

In addition to these changes, the state is using a new testing vendor and there will be greater educator input into the development of the exams.
