- > signs that a child is being bullied or pressured to participate in illegal/unhealthy activities
- the role technology plays in peer pressure and bullying activities
- how to help a child stand up to peer pressure
- over-the-counter drugs and prescriptions and the role they play as "gateway drugs"
- > steps to take to keep the lines of communication open between you and your child
- > steps to take if you find out that a child has become involved in drugs and/or alcohol
