Our meeting opened with our speaker, Roberta Richin, discussing organizing our lives and our children's lives. She spoke at an SCA meeting last year and talked about organizing our belongings at home. We, as parents, can help our children become partners at home based on our core values. Some core beliefs of a healthy family are communication, love and respect to name a few. A family is a team: each person plays a role or job, works together, and helps each other based on your shared purpose or goal. She followed her discussion with stating that each individual has dreams and goals. A family should build a team with daily routines. Ordinary work gets in the way of quality time is a common thought. But if it is not done, the family won't function. Each family should have a tag line or a logo like "I believe in you". It helps define each person's role. In closing, it is important to define each family member's role and what you want your children's role to be. It should be based on your core values. You want to figure out how a child can fulfill their role through ordinary routines. A child will make their role by design or default so if you guide them to their role, family will function better. It is also helpful to help your child realize that you can't be your best if you are not thinking of your team. And your team is your family.

Ms. Richin had to leave early and Christy continued with the meeting. She announced that the SCA is donating \$10,000 to CASA. CASA stands for Citizens Against Substance Abuse. We are in the middle of Red Ribbon Week where the theme is "Drug Free is the Key". Our speaker, Roberta Richin has been working with CASA and developing a community drug free support program.
