- New report cards were discussed. The revision of the report cards came because the state changed the curriculum due to the Common Core. Common Core changed priorities, level of rigor, and shifts in math and science. The old report cards did not reflect these shifts, and the new report cards now match the language of NY State.
- Other changes include the Reading Street Program and a new writing program called Writing Fundamentals.

Charles Cardillo-Superintendent of Schools

- Discussed Manhasset 2020 project, the District's Commitment to On-Going Long-Term Facilities Planning –Fall 2014
- The potential capital projects under review focus on existing space constraints and their impact on critical District-wide needs:
- SCIENCE science classroom/lab renovation at all three schools, providing larger and more efficient instructional and laboratory space for basic and advanced level science courses.
- **FINE ARTS** music room reconstruction/renovation at the elementary schools;relocation and renovation of the Music and Art rooms at the Secondary School; all of which will increase the instructional space devoted to the Fine Arts.
- FOOD SERVICES expansion and renovation of the Munsey Park and Secondary School dining areas, and air conditioning of the dining areas in all three buildings, easing overcrowding and overheating conditions in these large gathering spaces.
- ATHLETICS renovation of the facilities at Memorial Field and reconstruction of the 4 tennis courts at the David Dorman Tennis Center.
