- Overview of first day, new visitors' policy has been running smoothly. New policy came after many conversations with law enforcement. Tried to be sensitive to the experience of parents while making it safer.
- 45 teachers and 10 administrators are in their first and second year with Manhasset, about 20-25 percent of the entire faculty and staff.

Security vestibules at Shelter Rock completed; by the end of summer 2020 a new SEL (Social and Emotional Learning) center within the Middle School will be created to house 7-9 counselors and health professionals; the multipurpose area of Munsey Park will be reconfigured, and elevator will be installed in the Secondary School. The Secondary School asphalt and drainage project will be up for rebid soon, and 17 classrooms will be renovated.

• Summer Studies Program offers juniors a scholarship to do a program over the summer. Anoush Hogan and Luke Vetrone were two of this year's recipients. Anoush attend the Tanglewood Young Artists Program in Lenox, MA and Luke attended a week-long course at Hofstra for teen entrepreneurs. Juniors are encouraged to explore the opportunity. Guidance update—Ms. Joy-Anne D'Anca

- Elementary school has a new counselor. New transitions program introduced at the Middle School, every 7th grader has a built-in study hall—counselors pushed into these modules the first week of class and gave them a survey about how comfortable they feel academically and emotionally. They also did some ice breaking activities. Future subjects in the curriculum include organization and study skills
- October 24, 2019, Grade 12 parent night, 7pm—college discussion, counselors are pushing into every classroom now to see what students are thinking about re college and trades, etc. counselors will be meeting with individual students too
- October 3, 2019, 7pm —financial aid night—specialist from Siena college will talk about the dos and don'ts of financial aid

- 12th grade parent night is during Red Ribbon Week; CASA will present the sister of Maddy Halloran. Maddy committed suicide at UPenn, 5 years ago. The presentation will be about the pressures of social media for perfection. Will also have a community read of the book <u>What Made Maddy Run</u> by Kate Fagan (of ESPN) and book discussion November 18, 10:30 am at the Manhasset Public Library.
- CASA no longer has a federal grant so it heavily relies on dues, parents should consider joining and pledging to the SAFE homes pledge.
- Allison Rushforth, Director of Special Education noted that the district has a mental health support team and has partnered with Nassau County mental health organizations. The
