Class Fee: Each class is \$175 for the **10-week session** or \$190, if an extra fee applies. Extra fee for supplies applies to: Fun With Physics 2, Jewelry Making, Kitchen Science and Winter Crafts (\$15 fee). Checks are made payable to “Manhasset SCA”. **Please make individual checks for each child participating.** There are **no make-ups/refunds** after January 8.

- **Class Enrollment & Offering:** Classes begin the week of January 8. All classes taught by NY State certified teachers.
 - In case of inclement weather, be mindful of district notifications/cancellations.
 - Students may enroll in more than one class.
 - **Enrollment is limited. Classes are filled on a first come first serve basis. You will be notified of your class selection via email. We reserve the right to cancel classes due to lack of enrollment.**
- **Transportation:**
 - There is no early bus for the morning classes. **A late bus is offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays, which departs from Shelter Rock School at 4 pm only for Grades 3 and up. Only children of parents who are fully committed to their children riding the late bus on Tuesdays, Thursdays, or both days will be permitted to board the late bus. Class Descriptions:

Act Up!: An introduction to basic concepts of acting using various creative drama techniques to build confidence, stimulate imagination, movement, & role-play. Through theatre games, improv & activities students develop their creativity by learning to create a story in the moment, deliver both dramatic & comedic monologues & perform scenes with other actors.

Art Explorers: Explore 2-D & 3-D formats using a variety of materials and lots of imagination! In this fun workshop children are encouraged to explore their creativity through various activities - drawing, cutting, gluing, assembling, weaving, & decorating. Each week will be dedicated to a different theme linked to a story, a seasonal event or a song.

Bringing Literature Alive Through Drama: Children will expand their literary knowledge, boost their fluency, explore the elements of fiction & drama, and get excited about reading while acting out classic stories.

Cartooning and Animation: If you love telling stories through pictures this class is for you. Learn the basics of comic art, create your own characters, develop a story board and translate ideas into paper and pencil using simple drawing skills. Color and technique will also be explored. Imagination a must!

Chess Club: Students of all levels will have the opportunity to play friendly games of chess in a low-stress environment while sharpening their critical thinking, foresight and creativity.

Code Kidz: Come and learn Code in a fun and creative environment. Students will build a network of friends to work with collaboratively on Code projects and challenges.

Code Tots: Students will move at their own pace through scaffolded lessons to learn programming concepts in a fun, engaging way & then apply them creatively on multiple computer code applications. This class is different from Fall Session.

Creative Writing for the Young Writer: In this class we will focus on the art of creative writing. We will choose topics that are of interest to the members of our group. We will publish our final pieces.

Drawing, Painting & Clay Creations: In this class, students will use the elements and principles of design to create unique pieces of art. They will each gain knowledge & skills in drawing, painting & creating clay pottery.

Fun With Physics 2: Explore the exciting world of physical science with fun hands-on activities to investigate heat, sound, light, motion, & chemistry. Note that this is a new class from the fall but does not require a prerequisite.

“Greetings From....”- A Creative Writing Class: Students will take a trip around the world by watching a short video clip and then use their imagination to write letters to family and friends telling them about their amazing vacations. They will either color or use computer generated pictures for their cards and letters which will be stored in their own mailbox.

Intro to French: Learn the basics of a beautiful language! The focus will be on basic conversation, color, numbers, shapes, foods, etc.

Jewelry Making: Do you have a “thing for bling”? Do you like looking fancy in your beads and pearls? Create your own jewelry fashioned with beautiful beads, pearls & other fabulous baubles. We will be making jewelry you will be proud to wear! Necklaces & bracelets just like you find in your favorite stores! Come join the fun and “bead” with us!

The Joy of Signing: This introductory American Sign Language class will teach you the basics for signing. You will learn the ASL alphabet, fingerspelling, and various signs to build your ASL vocabulary through games and fun activities. Along with ASL, you will learn a little about the history of sign language and deaf culture.

Junior Journalists: Learn to write like a journalist. Students will research topics, write news articles, using headlines, subtitles, graphics, photos, and captions. They will also learn about the different types of news articles and practice writing them – news, feature, opinion editorials, and letters to the editor.

Kitchen Science: Students will experiment with common household materials to produce both physical and chemical reactions.

Learning Through Board Games: Work cooperatively playing games that focus on reading & math skills including making inferences, main idea, cause & effect, homonyms, addition/subtraction, multiplication/division. Students will be grouped according to level to ensure a stimulating experience. Each week will focus on different topics to keep it fun & exciting.

Lego Engineering: Students will use Legos to design and build simple and complex machines.

Music Club: Come perform, create, listen and analyze music using our wonderful Orff (xylophones, metallophones, glockenspiels, etc.) instruments. Let’s sing, say, dance and play!

Music Composition: Each student will learn the different components of writing a melody, learn about key signatures, time signatures, harmonic progressions, chords and much, much more! Our goal is to create a class composition by the end of the course which we will record and post on Mrs. Faltings' Manhasset website. Come compose with us!

Nature Exploration Club: In this class the children will explore Long Island wildlife and environment. Included in our study will be birds, insects, rocks, native plants, migration, mollusks, butterflies, crickets, clams and trees.

Speaking Spanish Through Literature: Students will explore a variety of literature in Spanish while learning to read and speak in Spanish.

Sports and Games: Students will participate in various sports in the gym. At each class a different game will be introduced. Students must wear sneakers to participate.

Winter Crafts: Warm up this winter season with some adorable winter crafts. We will be making bird feeders out of pine cones and birdseed. When the weather gets wintry, our feathered friends won’t go hungry, Snowmen out of shave cream and glue that pop right off of the paper and many more fun activities to brighten up the winter months.
