VI. School Board Report- Regina Rule and Pat Aitken

- Meetings are every other Thursday, all are welcome
- Next meetings are 10/4 and 10/18
- Manhasset has been deemed a Focus district by the State Education
 Department due to the low achievement of economically disadvantaged
 students on the grade 3-8 ELA and Math 2011 assessments. This is a
 group of 32 students that the district is committed to and a plan is in
 place to provide support and intervention for each student. The test
 scores from 2012 from this group showed gains on both the ELA and
 Math assessments
- A budget revision of \$400,000 was done over the summer due to increased enrollment at Shelter Rock, 4 additional sections were added
- The School Board is projecting that they will need a super majority vote this Spring for the budget vote which will be 5/21/13
- The Board is seeking Manhasset residents to serve on its Citizen Advisory Committees:
 - Legislative, Affairs, Technology and Athletics
 - Appointed for a 3 year term
